Caroline Criado Perez OBE is an award-winning writer, broadcaster and feminist campaigner. Notable campaigns include getting a female historical figure on Bank of England banknotes; getting Twitter to introduce a "report abuse" button on tweets; getting the first statue of a woman (Millicent Fawcett) in Parliament Square.

In her bestseller, *Invisible Women*, Caroline highlights the systematic, and often unconscious biases behind the data and assumptions that construct our everyday lives. From healthcare diagnoses to search algorithms, the over-reliance on men being the default standard has left women, and society as a whole, disadvantaged. Caroline's book *Do it Like a Woman* also looks at female role models from around the world, and throughout history. Alongside regular appearances on the BBC, Channel 4 and ITV and has written for *The Guardian*, *the Telegraph*, *The Washington Post* and *the New Statesman*. She has also featured in the documentary *Blurred Lines: the New Battle of the Sexes* and won the Liberty Human Rights Campaigner of the Year award.
