Meera's acting career includes TV drama roles in Broadchurch, Doctor Who and Absolutely Fabulous and, more recently, in HBO's The Brink. Theatre roles include leading roles at The National Theatre, The Old Vic and the Royal Court. She played Beatrice in Much Ado About Nothing at the RSC, Stratford, Shirley in Willy Russell's iconic Shirley Valentine in the West End (for which she won the What's On Stage Solo Performance award.) But for Meera, one of her proudest moments was tracing her revolutionary family tree in the BBC's Who Do You Think You Are. Meera was awarded a CBE for Services to Drama and Literature in 2015. She is also a proud ambassador for Breast Cancer Care and The Alzheimer's Society, and the long-standing patron of Newham Asian Women's project which provides refuges and advice for women and children escaping domestic violence.
